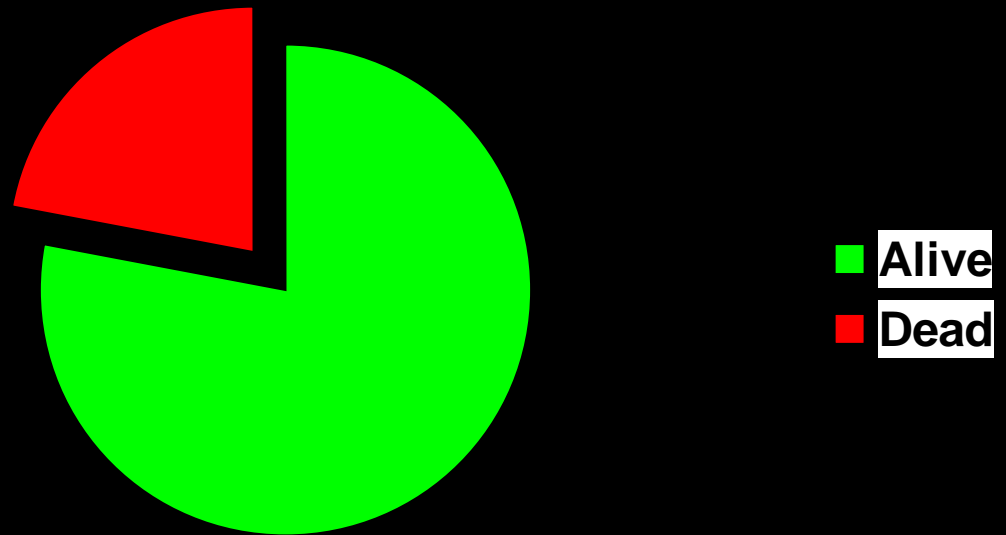

Measuring impact

- Quality of life
- Functional outcome
- Return to work
- Evaluating benefits changes in trauma care
- Health economic evaluation



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Types of functional measure

Self reported

Generic – EQ5-D, SF-36

Disease specific – GOSE, MRS

Age specific - PEDsQL



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How the data is collected

Web based

Phone survey

Mail survey

Direct email



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How the data is collected

Timing

Early – within 1 week

Medium – 30 days

Late – 6-12 months



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Comparability

TARN currently also conducting PROM pilot

Victoria State in Australia have largest cohort
